 - Please note: "Cornell University does not accept credit for courses sponsored by colleges but taught in 0 specific sections to high school students, even if the college provides a transcript of such work."
- The course is taken on a college/university campus or online with matriculated degree students, and is taught • by college/university faculty.
- The credits do not duplicate course work already completed at Cornell; •
- the credits have not been applied toward high school graduation or CALS admissions requirements
- the grade earned is "C" or better; and
- an official transcript is sent directly to the CALS Office of Student Services from the college/university where the credits were completed.
